Dear Mr. Low.

The material you sent to me arrived here some time ago. I have been unable to do anything with it, though, as until the last couple of weeks the sky has been too bright to see anything except the moon and Jupiter. We are not far enough to see the midnight sun, but for two months we can read a newspaper outside at midnight. One odd thing that happened a couple of years ago was that we could see Venus at midnight; it was circumpolar.

I am now working on the mounting of a 4 1/4 inch reflector; it should be ready soon.

As for what part of the sky I am interested in; we can't see very far south from here, and we are often troubled by aurora borealis about 10-20 degrees above the southern horizon (should this be called aurora australis perhaps, so it would be best to pick some northern areas.

The deadline for this week's mail is almost here, so I'll sign off now.
